




TRAVELLING AROUND EUROPE



Sometimes, you can just buy a bus **ticket**. Easy! You buy the ticket, you get on the bus and then you get off the bus. In other cases, you need to book in advance. Anyway, you need to know how buses system works. In Europe, the rail system is really good, and they are easy to hop on and hop off. Many travelers prefer trains, because they feel that they can enjoy the landscapes. You can move between countries in some cases, like from France to Spain. Airplanes are always going to be a quick option, but sometimes they are too expensive. Also, sometimes cheap tickets include airports that are far from major cities, and you **MUST** use an additional transportation.

Boats and ferries are used to transport people across rivers or short stretches of sea. They are not used for long distances. Can you imagine why? Finally, if you are old enough to drive and you have a driver license, you can rent a car in many European countries. If you are going to travel, look carefully for the transportation alternatives that you will find.


Realiza un "Itinerario" para impulsar un tour en Rancagua.
